IV.D.2.03; Members of the Lawrence community will not engage in (2.03) intimidation and/or harassment of another person or group of people through physical, mental, or emotional means, including behavior online.

II. Policies and Procedures. Personal Safety, page 79 of the 2018-2019 online student handbook

The board has decided on the following sanction:

You are required to write formal letters of apology to Professor _____ and Professor _____. These letters must be turned in by Tuesday, May 28, 2019 at 5:00pm to Associate Dean of Students Rose Wasielewski.

You must meet with Dean Linda Morgan-Clement for a reflective conversation. This conversation must be carried out by the end of the work day on Friday, May 31, 2019.

You will be placed on disciplinary probation for the rest of your time as a student at Lawrence. Further violation of the Social Code shall result in a minimum penalty of suspension.

You are not permitted to attend any of the remaining senior class social events.

Lastly, with the exception of the formal apology letter, you should have no intentional contact by any means with Professor _____.

Failure to complete any of the above sanctions will result in a suspension from the current academic term.

If you wish to appeal this decision you must inform the President, in writing, within three days of receiving this letter.

The members of the Board hope you understand that our responsibility is to hear all formal complaints, decide if a violation has been committed and apply a sanction when warranted. We hope you understand that you need to respect the rights of others if we are to maintain a satisfactory living and learning environment at Lawrence. The college community must insist upon the cooperation and responsible judgment of all students.
